



Evening Self-Care Rituals to Help You Unwind

Unwinding after a full day is a challenge for many, but because experts recommend getting at least 7 hours of restful sleep each night, it is something that needs to be prioritized.

Here are some evening self-care rituals to help you unwind:

Use essential oils. Aromatherapy has been shown to have a positive impact on mood. Certain essential oils⁵, like lavender, jasmine, chamomile, and valerian have been shown to have a sedative effect.

Adjust lighting. Lighting is heavily involved with your circadian rhythm and can have a direct impact on your sleep. For this reason, dimming the lights in the evening may help you relax and unwind.

Avoid caffeine. If you struggle with falling asleep, try reducing your caffeine consumption during the day. Limit your intake to the morning hours and see how it affects your sleep patterns.

Set a bedtime alarm. Use your alarm as a reminder to begin easing into a more restful state. You can set your alarm for tasks such as turning off the TV, tucking in your digital devices for the evening, or reading a book.

Upgrade your bedding. Assess the condition of your mattress and pillow. If neither have been replaced for an extended period of time, you may want to consider upgrading them.



Adjust the temperature. It has been suggested that the ideal temperature for sleep is 65 degrees Fahrenheit. Of course, this is highly variable from person to person, and it may require some experimenting to find the temperature that is right for you.⁶

Seek expert guidance. If you have tried a number of different self-care strategies and you still struggle to get good sleep, seek guidance from your healthcare team to explore other treatment options.

Creating evening self-care rituals can help you stay aligned with your natural circadian rhythms, so you can get better sleep.


TWENTY YEARS AND GOING STRONG




OUR GO-TO GUY!

Nip Seasonal Allergies in the Bud

More than 50 million Americans suffer from allergies every year. In particular, springtime allergies are an annual nuisance for many people. As plants begin to bloom and neighbors start to cut their grass more frequently, allergy sufferers nationwide start sniffling and sneezing. What's more, mold growth blooms both indoors and outdoors, making it almost impossible to escape allergy triggers.

Allergies are the sixth leading cause of chronic illness in the United States, according to the American College of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology.



For some, allergy symptoms may consist of sneezing a couple of times a year. But for others, seasonal allergies can cause congestion, a runny, itchy or stuffy nose, watery eyes, headaches and more for weeks or months at a time.

Fortunately, seasonal allergies only occur during certain parts of the year—usually the spring and summer. There are also natural ways to control your allergy symptoms since they are triggered by common allergens like tree pollen, grass, weeds and mold.

Alleviating Seasonal Allergies

Similar to other types of allergies, seasonal allergies develop when your body's immune system detects and

then overreacts to a foreign substance it thinks is harmful. To reduce your allergies, consider the following strategies:

- Wash your bedding every week in hot water to help keep pollen under control.
- Wash your hair before going to bed since pollen can accumulate in your hair.
- Limit the number of throw rugs to reduce dust and mold in your home.
- Wear an inexpensive painter's mask and gloves when cleaning, vacuuming or painting to limit skin exposure and dust and chemical inhalation.
- Vacuum twice a week.
- Make sure the rugs you have are washable.
- Change air conditioning and heating air filters often.

Treatment for most allergies is available both over-the-counter and by prescription. If your allergy symptoms are severe or chronic, you may need a series of allergy shots. Contact your doctor or allergist to determine which seasonal allergy treatment option is best for you.
