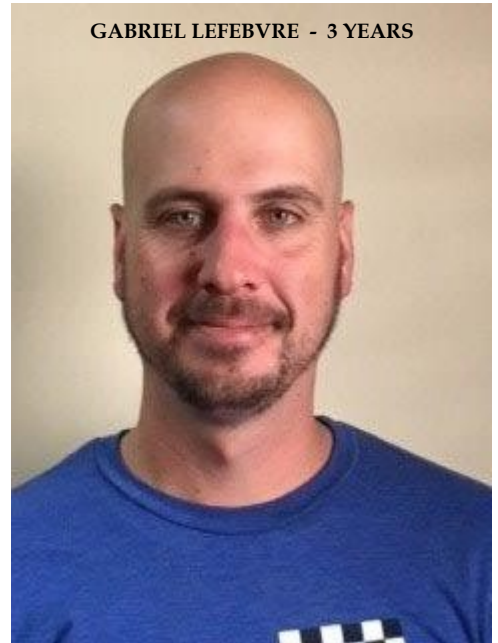

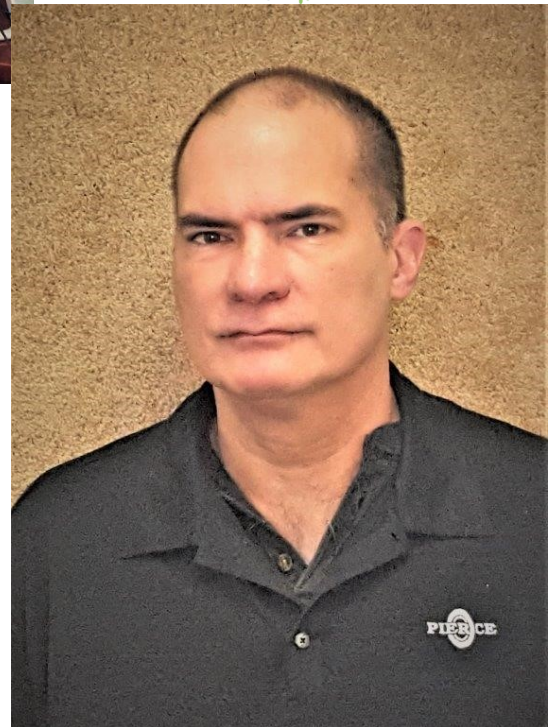
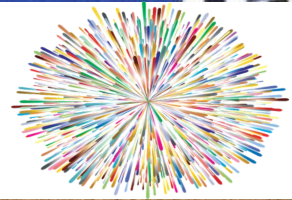

Sadly, my friend Les de Asis passed away in 2020. To honor his memory, PNDC introduced the annual "Les de Asis Annual Defense & Security Leadership Award".

For those not familiar with PNDC: in 2005, Les de Asis, Founder and CEO of Benchmade Knife Company; Clackamas County Commissioner Martha Schrader (Her spouse Kurt was in the US House of Reps for 14 years); Chandra Brown, Vice President of Oregon Iron Works (now Vigor Industrial); Rick Williams, retired Navy captain and director of the Columbia Region at SAIC; and former OECO President Barry Hendrix gathered to plan how to assist Pacific Northwest defense suppliers. You may remember ICP is a near founding member of the PNDC, ICP having been involved for 17+ years of the organization's 18-year history.

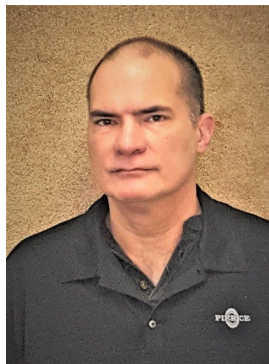
Our participation has given us some great exposure.

Be consistent: Establish a regular napping routine to maximize its benefits without disrupting nighttime sleep.

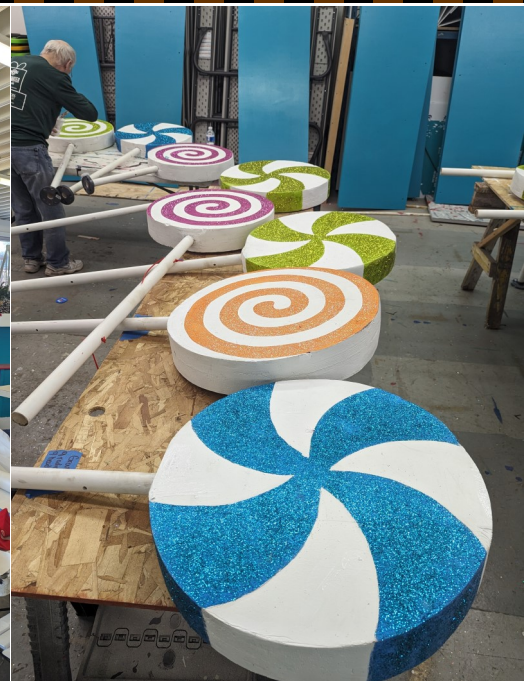
Conclusion:

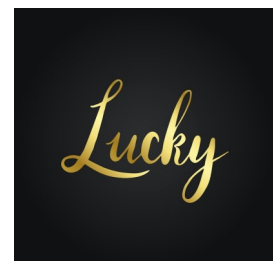

- Trypanosoma cruzi

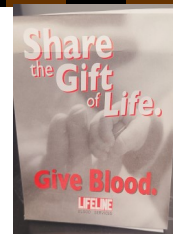
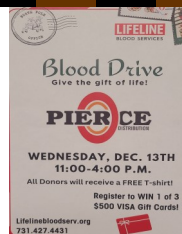
